### Health, Safety and Wellbeing

### **Cycle Training**

# **Safety Workshops**







The spring term featured a series of pupil workshops on online safety (centred around Internet Safety Day), with visits to many classes by Detective Constable Kevan of Cheshire Police's Cyber-safety unit.





Pupils also benefited from, and greatly enjoyed, sessions from the Dog's Trust, developing pupils' confidence around our canine companions.

### **Scooters**

Parents have expressed concern about both the speed at which scooters are being ridden on the access paths within the school site, and also their use on the school playgrounds, which has caused injury.

Please, therefore, ensure that your child does not travel too quickly on their scooter on the access paths, which are very crowded at drop-off and pick-up – older pupils (Y5 and 6) using scooters should dismount at the outer school gates, as should all cyclists.

Harder to achieve with younger (including pre-school) children, we appreciate, but can we also request that scooters are not ridden on the playgrounds, to avoid injury.
