We wish you all a peaceful and happy Christmas period, following what has been a term of near-normality, but with very clear signs now of more uncertain times ahead. The second half of the term saw classes in three different year groups enter enhanced safety measures for a period. The measures proved effective, however, and the outbreaks (more than two pupils with Covid in a class) were contained. No-one knows what the New Year will bring, of course – we are updating our contingency plans, hoping for the best but planning for other scenarios.

I would urge all members of the school community who are eligible for the booster vaccine to access that as quickly as possible, to mitigate the effects of the Omicron variant and allow as normal a return to school as we can (remembering that **pupils do not return until Wednesday**, **January 5**th). CWAC will actually be using our old school site as a vaccination centre from early January, so when booking online (not walk-in) you will have the chance to attend very locally (and nostalgically for many). Further Covid guidance is available in the *Health*, *Safety and Wellbeing* section near the end.

Christmas Celebrations

With considerable planning to minimise the risk from Covid, we were pleased to be able to present a variety of live Christmas events this year. Three different indoor shows were mounted (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2), together with a presentation of Nursery Christmas songs. With a larger number of classes



in the juniors, carol performances took place outside under the stars, which added considerably to the atmosphere (although did require a weather postponement of one

week for Y3/5 - roofs were invented for a reason, it appears). In all, to minimise the numbers on site simultaneously, eleven different performances took place, and provided a very welcome return to some degree of normality.



Other Christmas events included Santa visiting Nursery, an online panto presentation in each

class (with snacks and crackers courtesy of the PTA), and Christmas stories with hot chocolate in the outdoor classroom. Thanks to the PTA

also for providing much-needed warm drinks during the KS2 outdoor performances, and to Walkers Garden Centre for our lovely Christmas tree planters.

Health, Safety and Wellbeing

Road safety (Co-op)

Residents have expressed concern at the parking of some parents/carers using the Co-op to leave vehicles for drop-off and pick-up. Likely this use is not condoned by the owners, but this regardless, with delivery lorries accessing the site regularly, particular care must be taken when walking through the site, if an accident is to be avoided.

Covid-19

Visitors to school

In line with guidance, we strongly encourage any parents/carers entering the school building beyond the outer foyer to take a lateral flow device (LFD) test before doing so.

Daily testing for contacts of COVID-19

If identified by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive case (whether Omicron or not), all adults who are fully vaccinated, and children aged 5 and over, should take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating. If they test negative, the children can continue to attend school.

If they test positive, they should self-isolate and <u>order a PCR test</u> to confirm the result. If the PCR is positive, they must self-isolate for 10 days. If the PCR test is negative, they no longer need to self-isolate but should continue to carry out the remainder of the daily tests (responding again if a positive test result occurs).

For primary aged children <u>LFD test kits are available through the usual routes</u> (community test sites, local pharmacies or online).

Children under five years old do not need to take part in daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 and do not need to isolate.

Anyone over the age of 18 years and 6 months who is **not vaccinated**, **must isolate** in line with government guidelines if they are a close contact of a positive case.
