

Covid Outbreak Contingency Plan

Summary (Jan 2022)

NUMBER OF CASES	DESCRIPTION	ACTIONS
Stage 0 Low Community Transmission. No School Cases	 There have been no cases of Covid within school for 10 school days. Cases of Covid locally are low and/or stable. Hospitalisation/deaths due to Covid nationally are low. 	 No Covid measures are necessary beyond: Reminding children of good hand-hygiene Continuing with regular cleaning schedule Ensuring good ventilation Ensuring children/staff stay at home if they have Covid symptoms (and to book a PCR test if they do). Staff continue to do twice weekly lateral flow tests until the end of Autumn term.
Stage 1 A single child tests positive	 A single child tests positive for Covid in a class. There are fewer than 3 cases (or 10%) in the class. No other year groups are affected 	 The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it. The parents of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts. Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track and Trace and advised to take a daily LFD test for 7 days (before they leave home each day). Children who are close contacts do not need to miss school or self-isolate, unless they have Covid Symptoms.

Stage 2

3 children/staff within a class test positive within 10 days of each other

- As above for each positive case.
- The school will discuss the possible outbreak with Public Health and may plan to temporarily strengthen protective measures, depending on their advice. This may include:
- Segregating the class when indoors (e.g. at lunchtime); reorientating classroom tables to face away from each other; use separate toilets.
- Adapting, limiting or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances.
- Avoiding large gatherings.
- The school will Inform parents/carers of children in affected classes of the possible outbreak by letter.

Stage 3

Covid cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period



Despite the measures put in place, Covid cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that Covid is spreading widely throughout the school

The school will discuss the possible outbreak with Public Health to agree further measures which, depending on their advice, may include the following:

- affected class/year group measures to be extended/applied to the whole school for a specified period
- reintroduce year group bubbles
- reintroduce staggered access and egress times
- suspend school sports or residential away trips for any of the affected class/year groups
